**Occupational Licensing under Attack by DOL Secretary** DOL Secretary Acosta encouraged state lawmakers last week to eliminate requirements for occupational licenses where they're unnecessary, in a speech at the American Legislative Executive Council's annual meeting. Acosta said, "The growth of occupational licensing is part of a nationwide trend where we regulate, and regulate, and regulate." He noted that in 1950, 1 in 20 jobs required an occupational license. But today "more than 1 in 4 Americans need a license to legally perform their work," he said. Acosta added, "excess licensing hinders the American workforce" by creating barriers for workers who have less money; who want to move to another state; or who want "to leverage technology and to expand their job opportunities." ACCA will continue our outreach with the Secretary and his staff to help them understand this issue from the HVACR industry perspective.
